


#### **Congratulations to Zone Representatives**

### Spotlight on..... Tea Tree!

In English lessons, students in Tea Tree have been reading the novel 'Rowan of Rin' written by Emily Rodda and are learning about how dialogue is used to convey information about the actions, emotions and personality of characters. In this lesson, students were given an image of two people falling on a hike, and their task was to introduce a third character to the scene using dialogue to convey the emotions of 'what happens next'. After writing time, students were placed in small groups to role play a piece of dialogue to connect to the emotions and actions of the characters.



Students read through the text to find interesting vocabulary to describe actions and noted different sentence structures. Students then used their previous writing to continue a dialogue by adding a new character - the 'park ranger' or 'hiker'. The student in the above photo created a comic strip to add details and dialogue using speech bubbles. Students worked in groups of 3 to rehearse a role play using the dialogue a student had written. Tea Tree will be working further on their role play skills - watch this space!

## **School hats**

Parents and carers are reminded that the school hat is part of Daceyville Public School's uniform, and it is expected to be worn to and from school each day. We have seen a pleasing increase in the number of students wearing their school hat each day but there is still room for improvement on this school uniform expectation. The school hat offers students appropriate sun protection and wearing their hat helps students to develop life-long healthy lifestyle habits. ## New high school intake areas

High School intake areas in Sydney and the Eastern Suburbs have changed to accommodate student population growth and to align enrolment areas with feeder primary schools where possible.

The changes affect new enrolment applications received from Thursday, 29 August 2024 with consideration of the following:

- Current students at impacted high schools will not be required to change schools.
- Siblings of local students can still enrol at the same school together, even if the intake area adjustments make their home address out of area.
- Preferences submitted by Year 6 students for Year 7 enrolment in 2025 remain valid, however if students living in areas impacted by the changes would prefer to enrol at their new local school they may do so.
