

This week, we acknowledge Sorry Day and Reconciliation Week—national events that remind us to reflect on the histories and experiences of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples while inspiring us to strive for a more inclusive community. It is through conversations and shared experiences that we can build understanding and connection. We were honoured to have community elder Aunty Maxine at Daceyville, who opened this week's learning with a Welcome to Country and smoking ceremony.

Recently, Daceyville Public School students have been enriching and extending their learning beyond the classroom. Stage 3 students enjoyed an exciting excursion to The Rocks, where they explored the rich history of Indigenous and colonial Australia through engaging interactive activities. Additionally, a group of students attended the Sydney Writer's Festival, where they learned from incredibly talented authors and illustrators, participated in fun activities, and experienced the power of storytelling. This fantastic experience sparked their love for reading and writing, highlighting the importance of creativity in life.

Spotlight on..... Djamu Junior Metropolitan at AGNSW



Our Stage 3 Aboriginal students recently had an enriching experience during their excursion to the Art Gallery of NSW, where they participated in the Djamu Metropolitan Junior Art program. This event provided a fantastic opportunity for our students to engage with the vibrant culture and artistry of the Tiwi Islands.

Throughout the day, students worked alongside talented artists who travelled all the way from the Jilmara Art Centre in the Northern Territory, gaining hands-on experience and insight into traditional and contemporary art practices, including how to source and mix ochre pigments to make paint. It was inspiring to see our students immerse themselves in the creative process, expressing their ideas and learning new techniques. In addition to the workshops, students enjoyed a guided tour of the gallery's First Nations collection. This tour allowed them to connect with the stories and significance behind the artworks, deepening their understanding of Aboriginal culture and history. The excursion not only supported a greater appreciation of First Nations art but also encouraged our students to express their creativity in new ways.

Our rescheduled **Walk Safely to School Day** is coming up on **Friday 30 May**! It's time for our school to start seriously talking about walking!

This event encourages families to include more walking in their daily routines, helping to build healthy habits, road safety skills, and care for the environment.

Here are some simple ways to make walking part of your day:

- Plan a safe route using footpaths and crossings.
- Walk together regularly to build a habit.
- Practise safe pedestrian behaviour like Stop, Look, Listen, Think.
- Stay alert by putting phones away during the walk.
- Make it fun by chatting about what you see.
- Walk with neighbours or friends where possible.

In class, students have been learning about important road safety messages and practising safe behaviours near traffic.

To celebrate Walk Safely to School Day, all classes will head out for a short walk around our local community. Students will practise using crossings safely, looking out for driveways, and staying alert near traffic.

Family members are warmly invited to walk with their child's class! We will leave school at approximately **9.15am**, exiting through the **Banks Ave gate**.

Stage 2 History PBL Excursion

Thursday, 5 June 2025 - 9:00am - 3:20pm

As part of our History PBL project, students from Scribbly Gum and Tea Tree will be visiting the Art Gallery of NSW and The Botanic Gardens. At the art gallery, our guided tour will connect students with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander art and its diversity of practice across time, media and styles. After lunch, while guided through the Botanic Gardens students will be immersed in the meeting place of two cultures, exploring history through hands-on experiences to gain insight into First Nations people's experience of colonisation. The excursion links to our History PBL and helps students identify the special relationship that Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander people have to Country and Place as well as addressing our driving question. How can we teach others about contributions made by different groups and individuals, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to our community?

Students will need to be at school at 8:45am. Buses will leave at 9:00am. We will not be able to delay our departure for late arrivals. We are not able to refund the excursion fees if students are late.

Please note that our return time of 3:20pm will mean that students who normally catch the school bus will need to be collected or parents will need to make alternative arrangements.

Students are to wear their sports uniform, including school hat, and sports shoes for the excursion. They will require Crunch n Sip, a bottle of water and a packed lunch which they will eat at a picnic area in the Botanic Gardens. The cost of the excursion is \$35.
